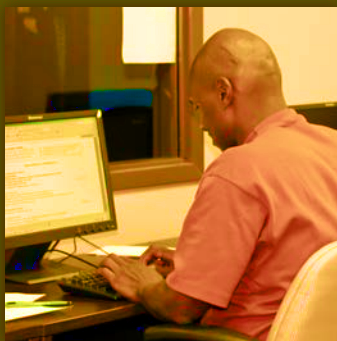

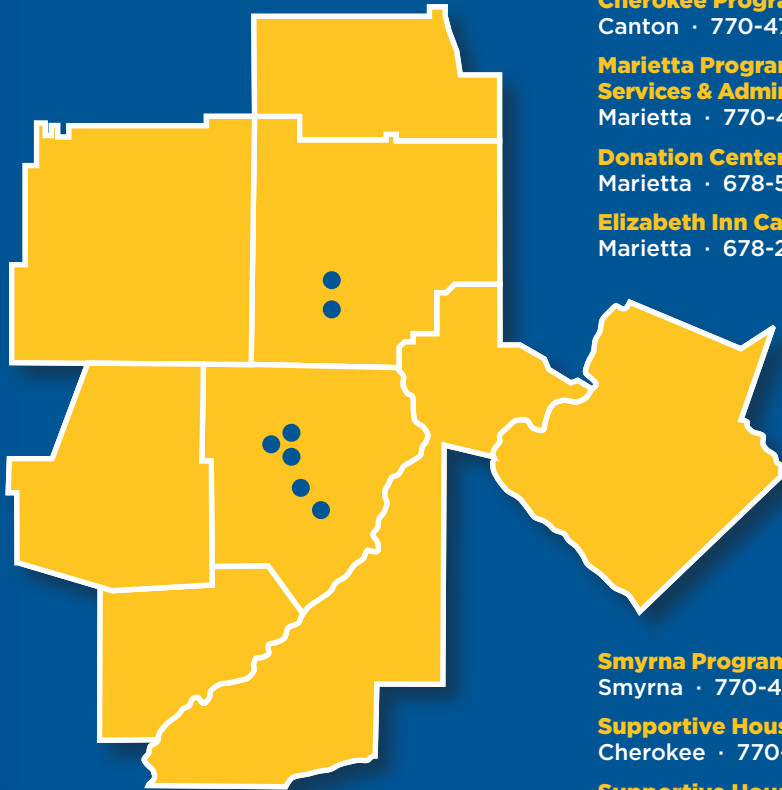

Cherokee and Cobb Supportive Housing provides a stable living environment for people with disabilities who have been chronically homeless. Through housing grants and other support, MUST operates a program in Cherokee and one in Cobb, including veteran's housing. Clients are provided case management, educational opportunities and skills for living in community.

VOLUNTEER SERVICES

Volunteers are the heartbeat of MUST. Thousands of people volunteer regularly, serve meals, sort food and clothing, provide guidance and support on the Board, assist in the MUST Marketplace, collect food, serve on committees and host toy drives at Christmas.

In Canton, Marietta and Smyrna, MUST offers program services to those living in poverty to help provide financial stability. Groceries from the food pantry, employment services and computer labs, clothing, toiletries, breads and sweets, and referrals to other resources are all available each week day. In 2014, MUST began a new, innovative thrift store called MUST Marketplace where clients and retail customers can shop side-by-side in an environment designed to provide dignity. The high quality and diverse selection of gently used and new items are in line with MUST values. This program creates a “triple win” by benefiting clients, community, and MUST’s financial sustainability.

Often called “the heart of MUST”, the Elizabeth Inn is the campus devoted to caring for those living in homelessness. The Elizabeth Inn Shelter features 65 beds for men, women and children and focuses on work recovery. The Outreach Center nearby serves homeless clients who live in places “unfit for human habitation,” providing case management, laundry, showers, breads and sweets, clothing and other services. The Loaves and Fishes Community Kitchen serves three meals a day and the Employment Services building houses a computer lab and classroom. Bible studies, mentoring, support groups and other empowering programs help the homeless become stable.

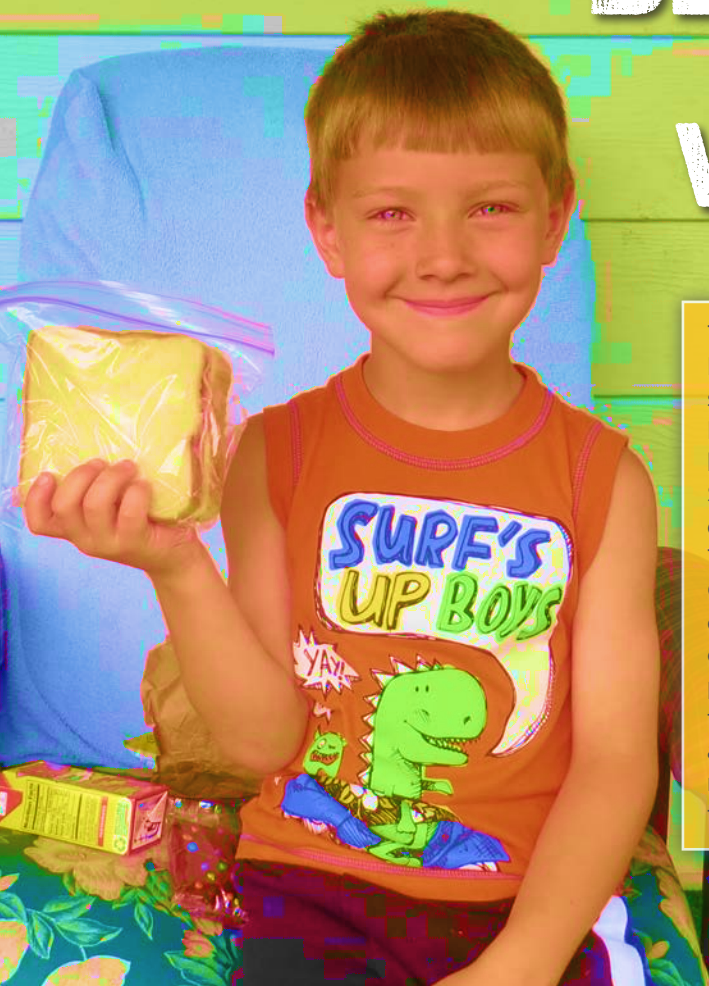
DONATION CENTER

The Donation Center is the hub of collection and distribution for all other MUST locations. A central source for collecting and sorting food and clothes allows each location to order and receive what is needed most. In addition, items for the MUST Marketplace are collected at the Donation Center, including clothing, housewares, small appliances, electronics, toys, sports equipment, accessories and jewelry.

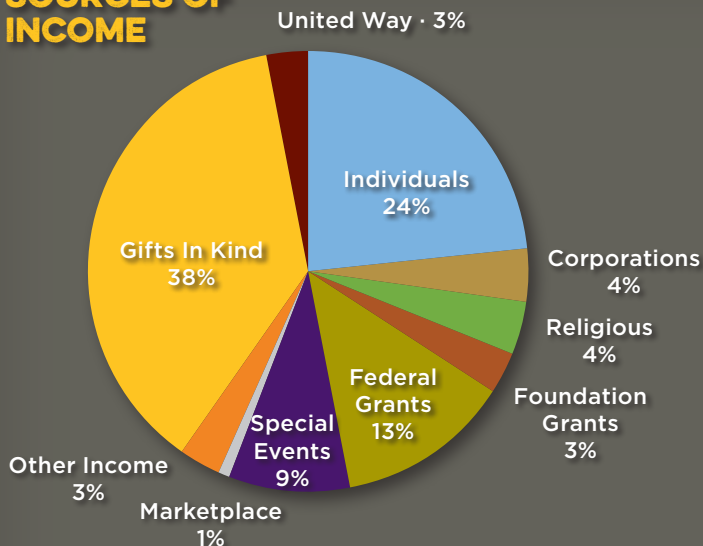


BEYOND OUR WALLS
