5 Security Risks That Spike During Vacation Season (And How to Prepare)



Summer vacations help your team recharge, but cybercriminals don't take time off. While employees are away and coverage is light, attackers look for openings. Here are five risks to prepare for:

1. Out-of-Office Emails That Reveal Too Much

Automatic replies tell attackers who's away and when they'll return. Keep messages brief and avoid sharing internal contact details.

2. Unattended Devices

Idle workstations with saved passwords or unlocked screens create easy access. Require screen locks and use multi-factor authentication for remote access.

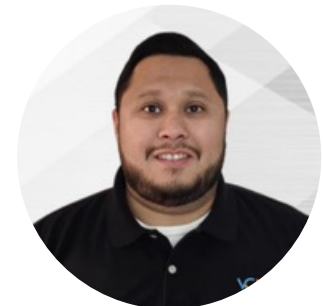

Desktop Battery Backup

Summer storms can strike without warning, and a single power surge can damage hardware or corrupt files.

A desktop battery backup (UPS) keeps your computer, monitor, and modem running during brief outages while protecting against voltage spikes and giving you time to save work and shut down properly.

Make sure your UPS has enough capacity for your equipment and replace the unit every 3-5 years as batteries degrade over time.



Backups stored in one place – If drives sit next to the server, they're vulnerable to the same damage.

Slow recovery times – You need solutions that restore quickly, not eventually.

No clear plan – Does your team know who handles recovery when disaster strikes?

Posting vacation plans in real time signals when you're unavailable. Encourage employees to share photos after they return.

1 Social Media Oversharing
What you post can give hackers information to craft phishing attacks, guess passwords, or impersonate you to coworkers.

2 Unused App Cleanup
Outdated apps create security vulnerabilities, uninstall what you don't use to reduce risk and improve device performance.

3 Mobile Security Checklist
Use biometric locks, avoid public charging, keep your OS updated, enable device tracking, and turn on encryption.

4 Your Phone Is a Security Risk
Between email, banking, customer data, and company files, your phone holds the keys to your business. Protect it accordingly.

- Notify your IT team in advance

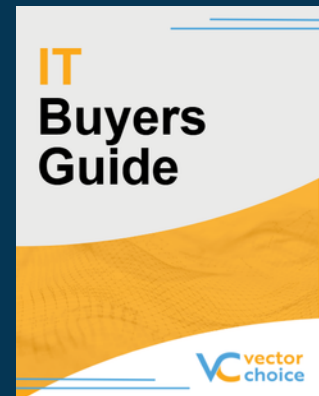
